Spas won the 100 freestyle at the Class 1A state meet - his first individual state championship - and placed second in the 50 free. He posted automatic All-American times in both events (100 free 20.37; 50 free 44.55), and in the 100 free avenged a loss to friendly rival Jemal Le Grand of Sagemont in the regional. He also anchored Heritage's 200-free relay, which placed third at state in All-American consideration time (1:26.73). In addition, Spas received the Andy Coan Award at the Woodson Invitational, an honor given to the meet's top swimmer. It's an award he said he had long desired. The Patriots' top swimmer, his performances throughout the season helped them capture district and regional championships.

Comment

The University of Florida signee, who was a first-team All-County selection the past two years, said he had his goals for his senior season set at the beginning of the summer. His times at district and regionals proved to be better than in previous years, and he peaked at states, im"I was just overwhelmed [with winning the 100 free championship]. I was like, 'Finally! Finally, I got it. That's what you work for. I'm just glad I got to do it. It was a great season. I can't be upset at all with getting my best times, and especially with winning [an individual] state title."

proving on last year's fourth-place finish in the 100 free for his first title. It was a happy ending for Spas, who has been part of Heritage's swimming program since the seventh grade. "As you go to your sophomore, junior, senior year, the pressure builds up to be not just the best swimmer but also the best leader and example," said Heritage coach Nobutaka Tan. "He was expected to be a good individual, good student and good athlete. He accomplished all of that."

Season highlights

Hammond placed third in the 500 free (4:49.44) and fourth in the 200 free (1:49.17) at this year's Class 1A state meet - posting automatic All-American time in both races. She also anchored Pine Crest's 200-free relay, which finished first (1:36.38 AA-A), and 400 free relay, which finished fourth (3:33.14 AA-C). Her finish in the 500 was her best ever for any event at states. At regionals, Hammond won the 500 free title and finished second in the 200 free. Her point production helped Pine Crest win a regional championship and finish third at the state meet.

Comment

Hammond, who has signed with the University of Missouri, quit swimming for a year before making a triumphant return as a high school freshman. She capped her career this year with a special season in the pool in which she says she made "pretty significant" strides. After advancing to the championship finals at states as a freshman and sophomore, she struggled in the preliminaries last year and was forced to compete in the consolation finals in the 500 free and individual medley. That "It was a really fun season. I couldn't have asked for a better senior year. My ultimate goal was to make the podium and that ended up happening. Our relay also won. I was really ecstatic about it. ... Ever since I made it to states as a freshman, I had always wanted to make it to the podium [individually]. It didn't really hit me that I finally made it there until I was actually up there."

"made me want it so much more, to get back to the A-finals and prove everybody wrong." She did, in part because she was able to overcome the nervousness that affected her in 2011. "Brittany Hammond had a great year. She was very dominant in Broward in her individual events and on the relays," said Pine Crest coach Jay Fitzgerald.
