

Title: Travel Documents accepted through September 30, 2007

As of January 23, 2007, when the U.S. Government's WHTI went into effect, all US citizens and foreign nationals now must carry a passport or other accepted secure documents to enter or re-enter the US from vacations or business travel anywhere in the Caribbean.

Based on information received through official sources in the U.S. Government, some changes have been made in regards to the legal travel documents for all U.S. citizens and aliens with legal U.S. residence traveling to and from the USA.

Based on the decisions made by the U.S. government and after consulting with a representative of the US Homeland Security Department, Mrs. Lee Ann Harty, U.S. citizens and aliens with legal U.S. residence, who have applied for, but not yet received passports will be allowed to enter both Aruba and USA with a birth certificate OR alien registration card (green card) OR a driver's license, AND DEPARTMENT OF STATE OFFICIAL PROOF OF APPLICATION FOR A PASSPORT THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2007. This must be shown upon entrance to Aruba to Aruban immigration officials.

Children under the age of 16 traveling with their parents or legal guardians or alone must carry a copy of their birth certificate, baptismal record or a hospital record of birth in the U.S in addition to their passport application status documentation.
